Notes From the Director

John Hopkins, Musical Director.

John Hopkins received his Doctor of Musical Arts (D.M.A.) degree in Vocal Performance and Pedagogy from The University of Iowa. In addition to directing the UAF Opera Workshop at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, he directs the Choir of the North, the Alaska Camerata and teaches private voice.

While at the University of Iowa, John performed approximately fifteen operatic and musical roles. Before graduate school, he sang for one year with the chorus of the Hessisches Staatstheater in Wiesbaden, Germany, his first real association with the nuts and bolts of opera production. During his tour of military duty, he was a member of the U.S. Air Force Bands and directed the Voices of S.A.C., the vocal show ensemble of the Strategic Air Command Band of Offutt AFB, Nebraska.

With the UAF Opera Workshop, John has directed many scene recitals as well as complete works. Most notable was the UA 75th Anniversary production of Verdi's *La Traviata* with the assistance of UAF Theatre. Recent productions include *Three Miniature Operas* by Darius Milhaud, *The Scarf*, by Lee Hoiby, *Impresario* by Mozart, *Comedy on the Bridge* by Bohuslav Martinu and Gian Carlo Menotti's *The Telephone* and *The Old Maid and the Thief*. Under his direction the UAF Opera Workshop collaborated with the Fairbanks Light Opera Theatre for production of Leoncavallo's *I Pagliacci* and Puccini's *Gianni Schicchi*.

John's first appearance in Fairbanks as music director was with the Fairbanks Light Opera Theatre for *Annie Get Your Gun*. Since then he has directed *Kismet* and *Pirates of Penzance* for FLOT. With the UAF Theatre Department he has directed music for *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* and *Guys and Dolls*, and had assisted with music in *Spoon River Anthology* and *The House of Bernada Alba*.

- 101-401 Theatre Practicum Participation in drama workshop or lab production as performer or technical staff member. Times TBA
- 121 Fundamentals of Acting Basic stage acting techniques for persons with little or no prior acting experience. Emphasis on physical, emotional and imaginative awareness. Scene work fundamentals introduced. Tuesdays & Thursdays 6:00 7:30
- 161 Intro. to Alaska Native Performance For Native and non-Native students with no prior acting or theatre experience. Includes both academic and practical components to examine traditional Alaska Native theatre mythology, ritual, ceremony and performance methods. Application of exercises and developmental scenes drawn from the Alaska Native heritage. Tuesdays & Thursdays 2:00 3:30
- 215 Dramatic Literature Studies of drama and forms of plays such as tragedy, comedy, melodrama, farce, tragic comedy. Reading plays of the classic theatre designed to give basic knowledge of masterpieces of the world drama. Tuesdays & Thursdays 2:00 3:30
- 241 Basic Stagecraft Materials of scene construction, painting, lighting design and their use. Students will be trained to use standard construction tools safely. The fundamentals of theatre drafting will also be covered. 39 hour lab required. Theatre Majors are encouraged to fulfill this requirement by their Junior year. Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays 11:45-12:45
- 247 Introduction to Theatrical Design Introduction to all the design elements used in the theatre. Analysis of line, texture, color, and how they relate to designing for the theatre including costumes, scenery and lighting. Mondays & Wednesdays 1:45 - 3:15
- 254 Beginning Costume Design and Construction Introduction to theory and practice of costume design for the theatre, methods used to make costumes out of a variety of media. Projects include simple hat making, mask making, stenciling, hot gluing and body padding. Tuesdays & Thursdays 11:30 1:00
- 412 Theatre History II Theatrical form and practice from the English Restoration through the present. Tuesdays & Thursdays 3:40 5:10
- 413 Playscript Analysis Investigation of the structure of play scripts designed to develop skills in analysis and interpretation for performance. Tuesdays & Thursdays 9:45-11:15
- 493 Playscript Development The class is designed as a participatory introduction to the practical methods, process, and techniques of creating performance. The class is for playwrights, directors, actors, performance artist, designers, and visual artists interested in the process and methods of new play and performance development.

Using a workshop format - - emphasis will be on practical and immediate application - the class will develop short plays and performance works. The class will be taught as a series of exercises and experiences, exploring techniques and identifying one's own personal resources and worldview. Emphasis will be placed on recognition and appreciation of one's own unique expressive vocabulary, performance objectives, and how best to articulate their expression. How to develop performance rooted in self, the earth and one's social and context will inform the workshop.

The course will culminate in the presentation of a performance showcase: The Seed Show, a public presentation of the semester's work.

Prerequisites: At least two theatre courses or performance experience as a director, playwright, actor, designer or performance artist. Fridays 1:00 - 4:00

Theatre UAF Faculty and Staff

Anatoly Antohin, Playwright and Director: Anatoly has directed many shows at UAF. He received his MFA from the Moscow Institute of Cinematography, and won several awards in drama. His plays have been produced in many European countries. In the USA, he has taught and directed at the University of Connecticut, New York University, and Hollins College in Virginia. The last show he directed at UAF was Reckless.

Steve Cady, Costume Shop Supervisor: Steve returns to the theatre world after a lengthy stint with the Internal Revenue Service. He formerly worked at the Magic Theatre in San Francisco and the Alaska Repertory Theatre in Anchorage, amongst others. He has been sewing for over 35 years, and has the calluses to prove it.

Amy Fautland, Theatre UAF's Dept. Administrative Assistant and Box Office Manager: Amy holds a degree in theatre and education from Biola University. She has a background in both technical theatre and acting. Besides running the box office she is an instructor for the UAF Summer Fine Arts Camp.

Gorden O. Hedahl, Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and a professor of theatre at UAF: Gorden holds degrees in speech and theatre from North Dakota, and a Ph.D. in Theatre Arts from Minnesota. He served twenty-two years with the University of Wisconsin System. He directed *Noises Off* at UAF during the 1993-'94 Season, and *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* in April of 1996.

Theresa John, Co-Director of Tuma Theatre: Theresa is an Assistant Professor of Alaska Native Studies. Along with teaching Alaska Native Performance she runs the Alaska Native Elders program. She has been involved with Tuma since 1978 as a performer, dancer and advisor. For Tuma she directed *Agayu* and co-directed *Naam* and *Inua*. She is currently developing a one woman performance which will premiere at UAF this May.

Judy Kreith, Dance and Movement Guest Lecturer: Judy recently moved to Fairbanks from Boulder Colorado. She has an MFA in Dance Education from Stanford University. Her choreographic credits include Stanford University Rams Head productions of *West Side Story* and *Jesus Christ Superstar*.

Tara Maginnis, PhD, Costume Designer: Tara is the author of numerous articles on costume in "TD+T", "Theatre Crafts", "Costume" and "The Lady's Gallery". She is also the Webmistress of the largest costume site on the web "The Costumer's Manifesto" (http://icecube.acf-lab.alaska.edu/~fftmm1) and of the UA-AAUP/AFT Union web site (http://www.alaska.net/~acadme).

Kade Mendelowitz, Lighting Designer / Business Manager: Kade came to UAF after teaching at Smith College in Massachusetts. Originally from New York, Kade loves the variety of arts Fairbanks has to offer. He recently designed the lighting for FDA's Barking Sharks and Northstar Ballet's currenlty running Snow White. Thomas Riccio, Playwright and Director, Has directed over a dozen plays with Tuma Theatre.
